NAMING OPPORTUNITIES

All donors to the *An Expanded Home for Achieving the Possible* Campaign will be recognized in a campaign publication at the close of the Campaign. Donors of \$10,000 and above will be recognized on a publicly-displayed donor wall in a central location on BFA's campus.

Renovated and Expanded Facilities

Outdoor Space:

Entry Court \$100,000

Along the new driveway of the school, this will be a high-traffic area for both students and visitors, particularly those needing access to the elevator on the Ground Floor.

Art Court \$100,000

This will be a place to celebrate student art and for students to congregate outdoors. There will be direct access to the Ground Floor meeting/classroom space as well as the art classroom.

Front Patio \$100,000

This patio, lined with bricks given in honor of Senior Students – and others – by parents and/or grandparents, will be visible to all visitors of the school. It will open up the current view of the front of the school, and become a lively meeting space for our students to enjoy the outdoors during free time.

Naming Opportunities in Renovated Space:

Foyer (Ground Floor) RESERVED

All who enter BFA from the Ground Floor entry court will pass through the foyer. This will be a high-traffic area for students and visitors.

Art Room \$50,000

On the ground floor of the new space, an Art room has been designed to meet our creative students' needs. With direct access to the outdoor Art Courtyard, students' creations will be put directly on display.

Science Room \$50,000

On the main floor of the new space, a large science room with a retractable wall will allow for maximum flexibility in classroom space – allowing for one large, or two smaller classroom spaces, depending on the need. In addition, a small area on the front of the building will be used as a small "green house" by members of our Green Club and for biology labs by biology students.

Naming Opportunities in Renovated Space (cont.):

Conference Rooms:

Large Office/Conference Room (Ground Floor) \$50,000

Meeting space on the ground floor will be directly accessible to the outdoor Art Courtyard and will allow for testing, meetings and other large meeting room needs.

Board Room (Top Floor) \$50,000

For the first time, BFA will be able to accommodate all members of the Board on campus in one room.

Small Conference Room (Top Floor) \$25,000

This space will be used for more intimate meetings with prospective students, donors, as well as other administrative meetings.

Expanded Workroom \$25,000

With individualized education tailored to each student, an expanded workroom will allow our teachers the space and materials they need to effectively prepare course materials.

Additional Study Space \$15,000

This space will be used for testing and/or meeting space as demand requires.

Office Space: \$15,000 each

Three small offices (Top Floor)

These office spaces will be used by BFA administration and teachers to conduct lesson planning, meetings with students/parents, as well as other administrative duties.

Kiln Space \$15,000

Thanks to the generosity of a friend of the school, a Kiln will be paid for and installed in the art room. Students will enjoy creating and displaying their ceramic works.

Display Wall \$10,000

In the Ground Floor foyer, this will be a wonderful place to display student art and have it celebrated by peers and visitors to the school.

Existing Space

Senior House

Media Center \$50,000
BFA seeks to remain on the cutting edge of technology for the ever-evolving needs of a 21st century learner. This renovation will update BFA's media center with new technology and furniture.

Classroom Space: \$25,000 each

Humanities Room

Familiar to students, this area is used for many humanities-related studies, as well as tutoring and individual work.

English/Psychology Classroom

This space is used for many humanities-related studies.

Music, Physics, and Math Classroom

Truly a multi-purpose space, this classroom is used for music, physics and math, among other things.

Small Classroom Space

Affectionately known to students as "Edward's Room."

Junior House (\$250,000)

Headmaster's Office \$50,000
The renovation will re-purpose the existing space for testing, administrative tasks and other meetings.

Front Office \$50,000
Immediately visible to school visitors, the front office handles all administrative requests, mailings, etc.

Math Classroom \$25,000

Conference Rooms (2) \$25,000 each
Conference Room space on campus is used for meetings with parents, students, testing, and other large-group needs.

Business Office \$25,000
The business office handles all payment and financial aid inquiries of the school. The high cost of individualized education leads many of our students to require some sort of financial aid.

Director of Records' Office \$15,000
As our unique approach to education is highly sought after, the Director of Records handles all applications for attendance and registration records for current students, ensuring that each teen successfully meets BFA's graduation requirements.

Junior House (cont.):

Counselor's Office: \$15,000 each
College Counselor's Office
Our students receive one-on-one college counseling to help prepare them for SAT/ACT Testing, the College application process, and other college-related needs.
Personal Counselor's Office
Many students benefit from BFA's personal counselor. Our counselor is equipped to handle emotional, behavioral and/or other learning issues.

Outdoor Space

Space in front of Junior House is available \$15-50,000
Depending on the space being named, an appropriate amount for the naming opportunity will be determined by BFA staff and Coxe Curry & Associates.
